Orthodox Etiquette and Practices

Go slowly up to the Holy Chalice with your hands crossed upon your breast to form a cross (right hand over the left). When we approach the chalice, we do not bless ourselves in order not to jostle accidentally the Chalice. – *The Orthodox Companion* p122-123.

It is only appropriate to sit during the reading of the Hours during the recitation of the Psalms, if you are physically able to do so.

Saints are powerful allies for parents and ideal heroes for children. It is for this reason that an Orthodox Christian is given the name of a saint at Baptism, and why we use that name when receiving Communion. – *Introducing the Orthodox Church* p96.
