FOR YOUR CALENDAR: TODAY AFTER LITURGY – IMPORTANT PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

SOLYANKA SOUP

200 g veal100 g canned green olives200 g beef100 g canned black olives200 g ham5 black peppercorns

3 ea smoked sausages 1 bay leaf salt (very little)

2 dill pickles, diced (aka cucumbers, below)
3 tbsp. tomato paste
3 tbsp. butter (or vegetable or olive oil)
herbs
sour cream
1 lemon, sliced

2 liters chicken stock

Shred the onion into semi-rings. Soften it in the pan but a bit (8 min). Add chopped into cubes (1/2-1/2") cucumbers, add some broth and stew all but a bit (8 min), do not allow cucumbers to get soft. Add tomato and boil for 5-7 minutes. Put onion-cucumber-tomato mixture into stock (chicken) and heat it to boiling. Right away after boiling add chopped (again into small cubes 1/2-1/2") meat products (the more various the better) and heat to get it to boil. [Some suggest adding shredded cabbage (1/4 head).]

Then add olives into solyanka and sliced lemon. It is highly recommended to add a little bit of canned capers. Solyanka should be thick enough. (Serve with sour cream, as desired.) Can be made with various kinds of fish (diced) or with a variety of mushrooms... deeelish!

THE DOORS! THE DOORS! LET US PAY SOME ATTENTION TO THE DOORS!

We need to be more conscious of parish security. The more people who have keys and who come in and out of the church for good reasons, the more chance that we forget to check to see that the doors are locked AND LATCHED. The front doors of the church are not automatically safe – we must slam then a bit to make sure that they latch securely. It only takes a second to double-check. Too often Father comes to church to find the alarm system turned off, the front doors unlatched, and even unlocked. And now, the phone calls at midnight from the alarm company mean that Father and the State Police have to come over to church (usually around midnight) and go through every room and hallway to make sure that no one has broken in to the church.

The State Police have plenty of other important responsibilities – I always feel bad dragging them over here for nothing... And I have enough stress as it is – don't need this spooky building check.

PLEASE when you are leaving, double-check and even triple check that ALL the lights are out, and that both the side entrance and front entrance are securely locked and latched.
