One of the ways in which we show our deep reverence for the Lord and the Priesthood is by asking Priests for their blessing. We receive a blessing from them in this manner:

1) Approach the Priest without making the Sign of the Cross;

2) Place your right hand open, palm upward, upon the left palm to form a cross;

3) Slightly bow your head and ask for the blessing in your own words;

4) The priest makes the Sign of the Cross, and places his right hand in your palm;
5) Having received the blessing, kiss the right hand which blessed you as a token of respect for the authority of the office held by the Sacred Minister in God's Holy Church and in thankfulness for receiving a blessing from the Lord's Ambassador.
